Trent Radio's programming is primarily produced by seasonal volunteers, with a focus on community engagement, local music and arts, and amplifying underrepresented voices from within our broadcast region. Under the supervision of Trent Radio staff and with the mentorship of an established local journalist, the LJI journalist will lead the creation of news programming for broadcast on Trent Radio. While the journalist will have support from a local mentor, they will be expected to work independently to research, report, record, edit and air their stories.
